EARLY HEAD START ACES GOVERNING BOARD REPORT

Period: November 1, 2019- November 30, 2019

Eligibility, Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment, and Attendance

- Monthly Early Head Start (EHS) enrollment was 60 for the period: Met full enrollment.
 - 55 children and 5 expectant families enrolled
- The program received 7 new referrals (7 Middletown) and completed 5 eligibility intakes.
- There is 1 family pending eligibility determination.
- The program has 0 income eligible families on the wait list.
- The program has 10 children enrolled with IFSPs, meeting and exceeding the 10% requirement.
- 7 families exited the program during this period. (2 aged out, 2 had attendance issues, 3 moved)
- Recruitment and community outreach efforts have continued in the shoreline towns and greater Middletown area.

Policy Council Updates

- Policy Council (PC) did not meet in November. The group will reconvene in January.
- PC will need a new governing board representative for the 2019-20 program year

Program Updates/Activities

- Early Head Start (EHS) submitted the recent federal grant application to expand current services in Middlesex County on November 12th. The design would include 73 new preschool slots in Middlesex County. The goal is to serve Head Start (HS) children in four center-based locations operating on a school day, school year schedule of 180 days with the intent of creating additional wraparound services in future funding cycles. Three of the four locations identified are in public schools. The fourth is at the established Community Development Institute Head Start (CDI) site owned by the Clinton American Legion. This re-competition proposal seeks to create a seamless B-5 Head Start program model by incorporating the HS children currently serviced by CDI. ACES has an unblemished 10 year history of providing quality EHS home visiting services to 60 infants, toddlers, and pregnant women in collaboration with established community partners. Expanding partnerships with local school boards and community agencies to encompass the HS children will enable ACES to provide quality services for children ages birth to five and their families.
- EHS Staff attended the CT Association of Infant Mental Health's Fall Conference in Branford CT on November 21st where staff learned more on embedding the Diversity-Informed Tenets into their work with infants, children, and families. In addition, increase self-awareness & reflective capacity about diversity.
- Circle of Security, the Opportunity Knocks Behavioral Health Group, and the CT Association of Infant Mental Health - Board of Directors met this month at the ACES Middletown Education Center
- Socialization groups and Parent Committees were held in November in Middletown and at the shoreline.
