THE HISTORY OF THE CONNECTICUT TIGERS

Overview:

The Connecticut Tigers is a winter guard program for performers with special needs who perform in exhibitions throughout Connecticut and in larger venues throughout New England and the Mid Atlantic States. Winter Guard is an indoor flag, rifle and dance program running from January through April, and is an off-shoot of fall marching bands. The performers are paired with volunteer Buddies from throughout New Haven County who perform with competitive winter guard programs. The CT Tigers perform at various competitions—seven this season—in addition to the SOCT Opening Ceremonies and, in conjunction with ACES, the Middletown Pride Parade. The Tigers have also appeared at the half-time shows of the WNBA CT Sun and NCAA Women's Basketball Elite 8 in Bridgeport. Every year, the Tigers perform in front of thousands of people, giving our members opportunities they might not otherwise get to perform and receive standing ovations.

Here are some points of information:

- The CT Tigers was founded by the Forte Family in 2006 (after seeing a special needs color guard perform at the Winter Guard International World Championships in Dayton, Ohio). There are only a handful of programs like ours throughout the country—we are the only one in New England. We have a strong following.
- The first year, there were 8 Tigers, 8 buddies and 2 staff. (Tigers were from ACES Schools and Cheshire. The buddies were from the Cheshire High School guard). This year (our 15th) we have 22 Tigers, 23 buddies and 4 staff from throughout New Haven County. Currently we have 6 current and former ACES students and consumers.
- Since costs were low, the Fortes financed the team for the first year. It has always been our vision to NEVER charge any performers for membership – we never want to say no to anyone.

- Starting in 2007, ACES funded our team. A budget was developed and submitted to the Executive Director and a line item was established. From 2007-2013, it was a 3002 line item in the Mill Road budget.
- Once Erika moved to PCY, a line item was established in the AED line item budget. In 2015, Erika approached Tom to discuss the budget. Since the majority of Tigers were no longer from ACES programs, she presented that it would not be fair to continue funding from ACES. We agreed that ACES would continue to be a major sponsor by providing gym space for practice, insurance for the team and any necessary office work, such as copying. Upon her retirement, it was agreed that there would be a restricted line item in the ACES Foundation budget.
- The CT Tigers currently is funded purely by donations and fundraisers. We receive monetary donations from our families and friends from throughout the state and some nationally. We have a large social media following and promote donations through those as well as at exhibitions where we perform. This year, we've begun selling Tigers merchandise as an additional way to raise funds. In addition, we get generous donations of equipment and pieces of our uniform from national companies who sell equipment to marching bands and color guards. Over the years, we have received flags, rifles, bags to carry the equipment, poles, show pants, etc. The monetary value of their donations is very high and they come back year after year. All of our major donors are listed on our website.

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5. Executive Director's Report-Dr. Danehy

Dr. Danehy introduced Ms. Habeggar and the staff at Thomas Edison Magnet School praising them for their work in meeting the criteria so that Thomas Edison was recently awarded by the Magnet Schools of America as a Magnet School of Distinction. Mr. Rice congratulated TEMS and its staff for receiving the Magnet School of America Distinction Award. The school will be honored on Friday, February 28, 2020 at 7:30 am.

Dr. Danehy spoke about the proposed Teacher Contract for July 1, 2020-June 30, 2021. The union ratified the mediated three year settlement which mirrors the state average of teacher settlements. Details were shared in the enclosed handout.

Dr. Danehy stated that a few budgets have been brought to the Fiscal Committee and those budget would come to the full board at the March Meeting.

Dr. Danehy asked to table the School Nurse Proposal so that we can gather more information.

6. Filing of the Fiscal Report (subject to audit)**-Mrs. Simoes/Ms. Riccio

The Executive Director recommended that the ACES Governing Board approve the filing of the Fiscal Report (subject to audit).

At the end of January, our bottom line continues to be positive, with slight adjustments to both the revenue and expenditures. Increasing enrollments in our special education schools help to offset the decrease in enrollment at the magnet schools. All other areas reflect slight increases or decreases as we continue to project our anticipated revenue conservatively. We continue to manage expenses conservatively with the consideration of the overall enrollment trend in our magnet schools. We are hopeful our current ad campaign will help us to attract new families and grow the student enrollment for the upcoming school year.

Our emphasis will be to continue to manage expenses, garner enrollment, and seek new lines of revenue and strengthen current core service income. We anticipate these strategies will keep us in a favorable financial position for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year.

EARLY HEAD START ACES GOVERNING BOARD REPORT

Period: February 1, 2020 – February 29, 2020

Eligibility, Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment, and Attendance

- Monthly Early Head Start (EHS) enrollment was 60 for the period: Met full enrollment.
 57 children and 3 expectant families enrolled
- The program received 12 new referrals (10 Middletown, 1 Portland, 1 Westbrook) and completed 10 eligibility intakes.
- There is 1 family pending eligibility determination.
- The program has 0 income eligible families on the wait list.
- The program has 8 children enrolled with IFSPs, meeting and exceeding the 10% disability requirement.
- 10 families exited the program during this period. (4 moved, 1 voluntarily withdrew, 4 delivered their babies, 1 aged out of the program)
- Recruitment and community outreach efforts have continued in the shoreline towns and greater Middletown area. The program has seen an increase in referrals from the Department of Children and Families and has made connections with the foster care unit. Children in foster care are categorically/automatically eligible for Early Head Start services.

Policy Council & Parent Committee Alliance Updates

- Policy Council (PC) did not meet in February. The members will reconvene March 25th.
- Parent Committee Alliance (PCA) convened February 18th and discussed the new communication tool Parent Square. Parents received a short overview of how it works and expressed excitement of its implementation.

Program Updates/Activities

- Early Head Start (EHS) hosted the grow truck once again in February. The CT FOOD Bank offers this customized vehicle with highly nutritious foods for families with children enrolled in EHS. Families attend a free workshop before entering the vehicle to learn about healthy eating or financial literacy. The Family Foundation of Stop & Shop makes the initiative possible and sessions will continue until March18th.
- The CT Head Start Family Service Managers, Circle of Security, Rehab Associates-B23 Group, Opportunity Knocks Behavioral Health Group, and the CT Association of Infant Mental Health -Board of Directors met this month at the ACES Middletown Education Center
- EHS Staff hosted a snack and paint activity for parents on Feb 13th. This activity is one of several focused on family engagement, family well-being, and parent leadership.
- EHS Staff participated in the SAFE SLEEP training facilitated by Dionne Lowndes on February 27th. This training provided staff with new knowledge and valuable resources for families on how to reduce sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS) or sudden unexpected infant death (SUID).
- Socialization playgroups were well attended in February.
