ACES Whitney North Notification of Positive Cases

Dear Parents and Community Members:

Area Cooperative Educational Services was notified that ACES Whitney North community members have tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19). The affected individuals have been instructed to remain home in self-isolation for at least **5 days from the positive test date** and may return to normal work activities on day 6 or later when **fever-free for at least 24 hrs. and other symptoms (cough, congestions, runny nose) are significantly improved** as per the Connecticut Department of Public Health *Updated Considerations for Quarantine, Isolation, Testing, and Contact Tracing Policies and Procedures in Pre-K-12 Schools* (https://portal.ct.gov/-/media/Coronavirus/FINAL-School-Contact-Tracing_Quarantine_Update_12312021.pdf).

Testing before returning to school or work on day 6 is recommended. Upon return (from day 6 through day 10), the affected individuals **must** wear a mask at all times when around others.

Staff member of Parent:

Please contact the school/program administrator on day 5 if you or your student cannot return to school or work on day 6 because you still have a fever or your symptoms have not improved.

The last exposure dates were December 22, 2021, and January 3, 2022.

Quarantine Update:

The updated CT Dept. of Public Health guidelines **do not require students and staff members who are close contacts to quarantine regardless of vaccination status**. The update requires that you monitor your child or yourself for any symptoms (**Fever, Cough, Fatigue or tiredness, or Congestion and Runny nose**) over the next 5 days. If any symptoms develop, contact the school immediately, stay home, and get tested. If you are concerned and plan to get tested, please wait 3 days from the date of this notice. Anyone who gets tested for COVID should share the results with the school.

***Fully-vaccinated** individuals are those that are at least 14 days away from their 1st vaccination for the Johnson & Johnson vaccine and their 2nd vaccination for the Moderna/Pfizer vaccine.*

Reminder:

CDC reminds everyone that vaccination is the best defense against COVID-19. COVID-19 vaccines are effective at preventing infection, serious illness, and death. Most people who get COVID-19 are unvaccinated.

Please continue to:

- **Consider vaccination if you have not already done so.**
- **Consider getting a booster shot if you are eligible.**
- **Stay home when you are sick.**
- Wash your hands frequently, but especially after using the restroom and before preparing or consuming food; using soap and hot water, wash for about 20 seconds. Be sure also to wash your fingertips. When soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid coughing or sneezing into your hands or in the air. Always try to cough or sneeze into a tissue, then throw the tissue away; if you do not have a tissue, cough/sneeze inside the elbow of your arm.
- Avoid touching your eyes, mouth, and nose as much as you can.
- Wear a face covering (mask) whenever there is a likelihood that you or your family members will be in the presence of others.
- Implement distancing to the extent practical as part of a layered mitigation strategy in all areas of the school
